## 4. Matters Arising

#### (i)- Community.

#### a) Parish Pastoral Centre:

**Constitution**: It was agreed that the reason for the Constitution was to ensure that the Centre had clear objectives and achieved them effectively, despite any change in personnel that may occur. The following amendments were AGREED:

- ➤ Replace the section on the Annual General Meeting (paragraphs 6, 7 and 8) by a new paragraph 6 'The Management Committee shall report directly to the Parish Priest. The Management Committee shall meet the Parish Pastoral Council at least once every year to discuss progress and matters of common interest under the chairmanship of the Parish Priest.'
- That the name 'Management Committee' be used instead of 'Executive Committee' in all documents.

#### Management:

#### **Appointment of members of the Management Committee**

Noted that the following had accepted nomination to the Management Committee: Eithne Doyle, Peter O'Flanagan, Brendan Riordan and Bernard Walsh. It was also noted that two of these four were also members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). In addition, Fr Dermot as Parish Priest and Fr Bill would also be members, ex officio, of both the Management Committee and the PPC. The Chairman added that the key role of the Management Committee was to see that things got done and this called for a small group of no more than eight members, to be effective.
